

# Matching Tests

Grade 9

This section consists of matching tests for each of the 36 lessons shown in the Words Lists. Each lesson consists of 20 words: ten newly introduced words and 10 previously introduced words. At no time will students be responsible for a time period of greater than four weeks. Repetitious study of the definitions will help the students to learn the words.

In order for a student to be successful with this program, he must keep all definitions either in a section in his binder or in a spiral notebook so that he can review definitions from previous lessons which will be on each vocabulary test.

## Teaching Tips

Teachers have two tests for each lesson: a matching test and a sentence completion test.

- One test can be used as practice, while the other is used for grades.
- One test can be used as the regular test, while the other is used as a make-up test.
- For the greatest benefit to the students, both tests should be used at some time. Students will benefit from the extra exposure to the words.
